*Early Man* tells the story of Stone Age caveman Dug and his tribe's attempts to fence off attacks from Lord Nooth and his army of the Bronze Age City. Dug's subsequent adventures in Bronze Age City with local girl Goona has led the cavemen to the football field, where a game between the two tribes under the watchful eyes of Queen Oofoefa of the Bronze Age City will determine the fate of the cavemen and their homeland.

Despite being deemed eccentric, his paintings of anthropomorphized cats forever changed the way cats were perceived in the European society.

Organised by Central Venue Management, the exclusive operator and manager of the Central Harbourfront Event Space, *SummerFest* returns for the sixth year. With "Wild in the City" as this year's theme, visitors can breathe in the fresh sea breeze, take in the sunset and starlight, and join in the various activities and performances.
